



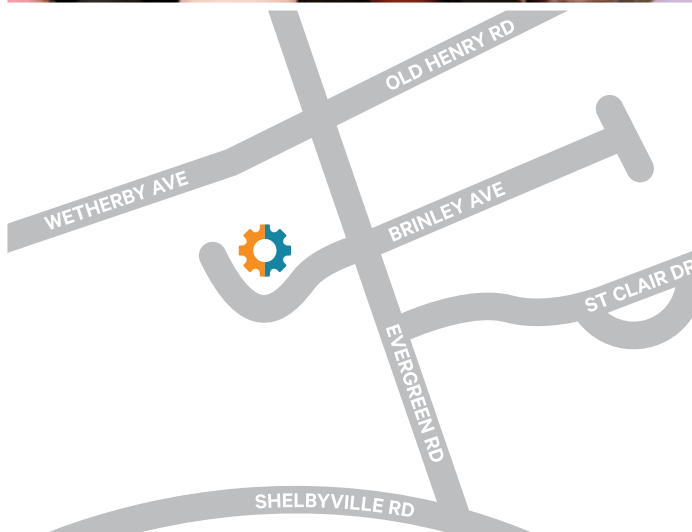
Who We Are
