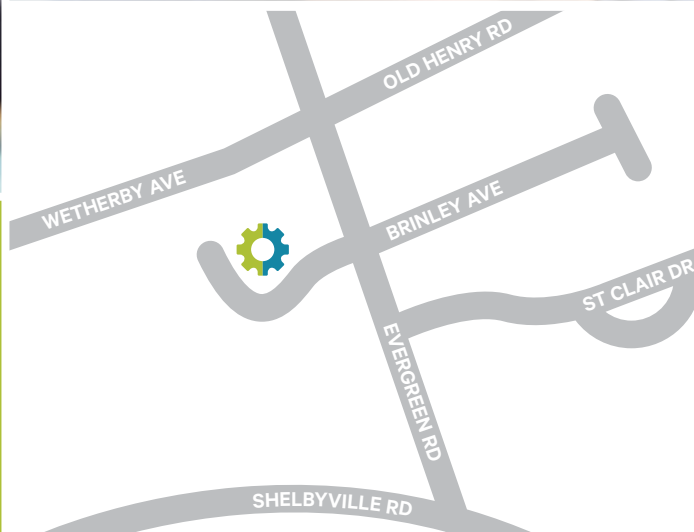
## Who We Are

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## Academic Performance

If a child struggles with any of the following problems, we may be able to help.

- Staying in Seat/Falling Off Chair
- Organizing Space or Materials
- Sustaining Attention Span
- Following Directions
- Establishing Hand Dominance
- Putting on/Taking Off Coat
- Managing Fasteners on Clothing
- Coping with New Situations/Transitions
- Initiating/Terminating Activities
- Respecting Personal Space
- Holding/Manipulating Scissors
- Maintaining Appropriate Posture
- Following Rules and Routines
- Keeping Pace with Peers
- Bumping Into Others or Objects
- Discriminating Shapes, Colors, or Letters
- Holding Pencil with Appropriate Grasp
- Handwriting (Rate, Legibility, Reversals)
- Coloring, Drawing, Tracing
- Copying from Board or Desk

These problems can be caused by underlying issues with sensory processing, gross motor skills, or fine motor skills.



## What Can Be Done?
